We are a people of promise. For centuries, God prepared people for the coming of his Son, our only hope for life. At Christmas we celebrate the fulfillment of the promises God made—that he would give a way to draw near to him.

Advent is what we call the season leading up to Christmas. It begins four Sundays before December 25, sometimes in the last weekend of November, sometimes on the first Sunday in December. This year it is December 1.

From the Pastor

Advent comes from the Latin word which means "come". This season of Advent looks back to the birth of Jesus, and the preparation made to receive him. When Beth was pregnant with our first child, we had much preparation to do. We had to prepare a place for him/her (we didn't

know until Mark was born) to sleep. We had to clean our little rental house so that it was safe. We had to prepare by buying a car seat, and then struggle to learn how the thing worked! All this was relatively easy.

What was hard was to open our hearts to welcome a new life. Up until Mark's birth, we had been relatively free to do what we wanted, when we wanted. Go to a movie? Great, let's go! But having an infant made some huge changes in our lives, for which we are thankful, but the changes were difficult.

Welcoming Jesus can be similarly difficult. God sent Jesus to be more than our "co-pilot", but rather our Lord and Savior. To follow Jesus means that my life is no longer my own. I answer to a different boss, and I adopt different values. Instead of hate, I learn to love. Instead of judgment, I learn grace. Instead of power, I learn to serve others. Instead of arrogance, I learn humility.

So Advent can be a season to once again prepare our hearts to receive Jesus anew.

But Advent also looks forward to Jesus' return, his second coming. We long for the day when there will be no more suffering and sickness. We long for the day when there will be no more violence and oppression. We long for the day when there will be no more death and destruction. We long for the day when God will wipe away every tear. We long for the day when peace and justice will be the norm, not the exception.

This, too, requires preparation. As followers of Jesus, we begin to live by those values, and choose those behaviors which reflect God's kingdom. This requires discipline, time, practice, and lots of forgiveness! The miraculous thing is, the more I forgive others, the more I find myself forgiven. The more I work for peace, the more I find myself at peace with God. The more I seek to serve others, the more I find myself unconcerned with myself.

Advent can often be a difficult season for many people. It is especially hard for those who have experienced loss, and are grieving. But it is also hard for those who are sick. Or those who are experiencing unemployment. Or divorce. Or family strife.

I am moved by this quote from Shauna Niequist in her book, "Bittersweet: Thoughts on Change, Grace, and Learning the Hard Way".

"I believe deeply that God does his best work in our lives during times of great heartbreak and loss, and I believe that much of that rich work is done by the hands of people who love us, who dive into the wreckage with us and show us who God is, over and over and over. There are years when the Christmas spirit is hard to come by, and it's in those seasons when I'm so thankful for Advent.
