From the Pastor

I had a great time in St. Louis last week. The Stewardship Kaleidoscope Conference was informative and well-done. And I got to see some people I had met in previous years, and some old friends from Manteca, Pastors Karl and Jennifer Hauser.

Every fall, churches around the country struggle with this thing called Stewardship. What does "stewardship" mean?

Lutheran Pastor Chick Lane said, "For most people, 'stewardship' is a code word."

"For most congregation members, it is code for 'What the congregation does to get some of my money out of my pocket and into the offering plate.' (and my job is to give just enough to not feel guilty)"

"For most congregation leaders, it is code for 'Those things we have to

do to get enough money to pay the bills.' (and we know how well we have done at year end

when we know if we have enough money to pay all the bills)"

Does that fit your understanding of stewardship? I hope not! Stewardship is about much more than just collecting money and paying bills.

In the Bible, a steward was a person who was placed in charge of the property and possessions of another person. The steward was responsible to steward those resources for the owner. They key point is that the resources did not belong to the steward.

God has given each of us gifts. Gifts of time. Gifts of talent. And gifts of treasure. Some of us have many of

those gifts. Others of us, not so many. But we all have been gifted by God. And stewardship is how we use those gifts for the owner to whom we are responsible.

Lane defined stewardship this way:

"Stewardship is a wonderful word that describes how a follower of Jesus Christ faithfully travels through this life."

In other words, stewardship is about discipleship. Stewardship is *not* about a congregation's bills and budgets.

Leaving money in an offering plate is an act of generosity, but our stewardship does not end there. How we use our talents is our stewardship: singing in the choir, greeting people, teaching Sunday School, serving cookies, sending cards, feeding the homeless, praying at the prayer meeting, and more.

And how we spend our time is also a matter of stewardship. God has given us 24 hours a day, 168 hours a week. How will we use those hours to honor God and bless others?

Harvest is a very financially generous congregation. We are ranked first in our presbytery in giving per member. One pastor told me, "If we gave at the level of Harvest, we'd easily have a half million dollar budget!"

There have been some people in Harvest's past that have been generous beyond their lifetime. The Wolfes left quite an endowment to the work of Christ through Harvest. Marie Neal was also generous in leaving resources for our work with children and youth. A fund was set up in memory of Linda Strange to provide campership money for those wishing to attend a Christian camp. Recently, we received the last part of a trust distribution from Doyce and Arlene Smee.

Dorothy Nelson has also generously pre-funded a fund for children and youth. You'll be hearing more about this in the weeks ahead.

Harvest is also incredibly generous with time. Many of you volunteer in various ways around the church, serving on leadership, committees, teaching Sunday School, serving in other ways like Work Days.

But you also use your time to feed those less fortunate through the food bank, you collect items for the homeless and the

Modesto Gospel Mission and Interfaith. You volunteer with the Lions or Rotary or Soroptomist or Persephone Guild raising money for scholarships, but also serving the community. Some of you volunteered to help with the Love Ceres event or volunteer to sing in the Habitat for Humanity choir. And the list goes on.

One of the ways that we use our gifts and talents and time is to serve the church as an elder or a deacon. The Nominating Committee is currently praying about who God is calling to serve in those roles. I would ask that you pray about whether God is calling you, so when you are asked, you can say, "I say 'yes' to God's call."

Your stewardship is not just financial, but also your time and talent. It is our response to the God who gave us all of our gifts to begin with, and our act of devotion to Him.
