

There are several things happening in July at Harvest.

First, our worship time will change for July and August. We will begin worship at 9:30 a.m. We will do this to worship in the cool of the morning. There were actually some votes for a Sunday evening service. I don't know whether that meant "in addition to" or "in place of". I like the thinking, and the

Worship Committee will be discussing it.

Most importantly, our Vacation Bible School is coming up July 14-18. Ably directed by Cyndy Cawley, we are praying for 50 children. We have placed an ad on Facebook for people living in Ceres, especially parents with 3-12 year olds at home. So far, we have had over 2,000 people look at the ad, though about 45 have actually clicked on our web page for the registration form.

I ran into this article some time ago that reminds us of why we do VBS. I never went to VBS as a child, and I regret not ever hearing of Jesus Christ (except swearing) until I was in college at Davis.

(VBS) signs are popping up all over. These are a definite indication that we're in the midst of summer, which means kids are looking for something fun to do and parents are probably ready for a break. But before you mark off Vacation Bible School as just a mid-summer nanny, consider the importance of sending youngsters to a week of Bible day-camp.

VBS crosses just about every denomination, and most carry a theme that will be the focus of the Bible study, activities and crafts. Kids are often joined by a few puppet or theme characters who pitch in to help get the word across to participants: God loves them, and they are part of his universal family.

According to Kathy George, this year's VBS director for Calvary Chapel Oroville, it was just such a week that kindled her lifelong relationship with Christ.

George was just four years old when she attended a Vacation Bible School, and although she didn't accept the Lord as her savior until many years later, that one experience was enough to show George that she was never alone. "My life became very difficult shortly after that experience," said George. "I can honestly say that had I not been to Vacation Bible School and learned about a God who loved me, I wouldn't be alive."

Her experience is reminiscent of the story in Luke, when Jesus cautioned his disciples to not hinder a group of children who had been brought to

him for a blessing. He told them, "Let the children come to me! Don't try to stop them. People who are like these children belong to God's kingdom." Luke 18:15 (CEV).

George said from that one week experience, all those years ago, she realized that once she was in God's family, she was always in God's family. "I just knew that no matter what, God loved me and would make sure everything turned out all right."

Whether children attend church regularly or have never been to a Sunday service, VBS is the perfect opportunity to introduce them to Christ through a meaningful personal experience.

Can you imagine what someone may write 30 years from now, looking back on a VBS at Harvest Presbyterian Church in 2014 that changed their lives forever? What a wonderful thing that would be! Beyond praying for numbers, I am praying for spiritual impact. Please join me in doing so.

Lastly, we will be reading through the Psalms this summer. I am excited about this, having never preached through the Psalms. And I love the Psalms for their authenticity and their hope. 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SAVING FAITH—Margaret Kuglin

One of the greatest gifts that God has given us cannot be bought with money. Jesus said a great deal about faith and the more we exercise it the better we do with it. Faith is the powerful and precious fruit of the Spirit. We do not come into the world knowing how to rely on God. We have to learn how to depend on Him and His power and strength.

Three Types of Faith

- Intellectual faith is also called "natural faith". Both the believer and unbeliever have this faith,
 but the devil and his demons have it, too. This is defined as believing something is true without
 proof or commitment. A person believes that Jesus was a historical person who lived on earth,
 was a good person, and a prophet, but does not accept the fact that He was God in the flesh
 and came to die on the cross for our sins.
- Godly faith is the confident conviction that whatever God has promised he will fulfill.
- Saving faith is trusting in Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and eternal life with a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and the gift of eternal life. This kind of faith is renouncing sin, having a personal relationship with God and giving our lives to Him.

Four Grades of Faith

Because of the opposition and persecution the disciple would be facing, it was very important for Jesus to teach his disciples about faith. They needed to understand what it meant to believe and trust Him and to establish their faith.

- No faith. In Mark 4:35-41, the disciples were in a boat with Jesus sleeping on the pillow in the stern of the ship when a storm came up. It was so bad that they awakened Jesus and said, "Teacher do you not care that we are perishing?" The question showed the lack of faith on their part. Jesus said, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" We lack faith when we question God about how He is dealing with us.
- Little Faith. In Matthew 16, the Pharisees and Sadducees demonstrated this faith by asking Jesus for signs and miracles. The disciples showed it, too. They had forgotten to bring bread as they crossed the sea. Jesus taught them, "beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees." The disciples reasoned among themselves, "It's because we have not brought bread." Jesus responded, "O you of little faith," and went on to remind them of the abundance of loaves and fishes left over from feeding large crowds. Like the disciples, we're worried about bread. When we focus on earthly worries instead of learning the spiritual truth that God is teaching us that we have little faith.
- Great faith. In Matthew 8:5-8, Jesus met with the centurion who asked Jesus to heal his paralyzed servant. He told Jesus to just say the word and his servant would be healed. Jesus said, "I have not found such great faith in all Israel (v.10). Why did Jesus say this? Because when we take Him at his word and trust Him completely, when we don't require proof that He will fulfill His promise to us, then we have great faith.
- Failing faith is something each of us experiences. In Luke 22:31, the Lord said, "Simon, Simon! Satan has asked for you, that he might sift you as wheat. But I have prayed for you, that your faith should not fail; and when you have returned to Me, strengthen your brethren." True to Jesus' word, Peter later denied knowing Jesus three times. But also true to Jesus' word, Peter did strengthen the disciples later on.

Satan is always challenging our faith. 1 Peter 5:8 states, "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour." We need to know we are in a war zone. There are many casualties when we think things are going so good and we are at peace.

We can trust God to take us through all our problems if we ask Him. He promises to give us strength and wisdom if we ask Him and trust Him. He challenges believers to trust Him. Do you trust Him? What grade of faith does your faith fall in?
